As you travel the Mother Road through Missouri, Pulaski County is one section known for the scenic beauty, As you drive across the ___bridge in Devils Elbow you can see the “Sugar Bowl” bluffs, stop off at the roadside overlook and take in the scenic view of the river valley and wooden trestle bridge, Grab a great BBQ sandwich at the Elbow Inn and BBQ Pit, the original location of the Munger Moss Sandwich Shop.

The Mother Road, Route 66, runs right through Lebanon and attracts enthusiasts from all over the world. Learn more about it at the Route 66 Museum and Research Center. This fascinating 3,500-square-foot museum inside the Laclede County Library features faithful re-creations of a 1950s gas station and a classic diner, plus a rotating collection of antique cars. The research center contains hundreds of Route 66 books, magazines, videos and 650 highway maps from 1915 on. Admission is absolutely free.

The jewel of the community is the Kenneth E. Cowan Civic Center, a 126,000-sq.ft. state-of-the-art multipurpose facility with a 46,000-sq. ft. exhibit hall, a 675-seat theatre, an NCAA-approved lap pool, gymnasium and fitness center. Concerts, circuses, ice shows and a gigantic annual garage sale all take place at this impressive community center.

Springfield, the third-largest city

In Missouri, is where Route 66 got its name, thus the city has the distinction of being known as the Birthplace of Route 66.

Cruising along Route 66 in Springfield, visitors can still see historic motor courts and mom-and-pop shops. The Mother Road goes right through the heart of the city, including Park Central Square, a thriving entertainment district filled with galleries, restaurants, boutiques and nightclubs. Among the highlights are the historic Landers Theatre and the Gillioz Theatre, both beautifully restored and used for a variety of performances and entertainment options.



A short side trip off Route 66 leads to family-friendly attractions, including Bass Pro Shops Outdoor World, Fantastic Caverns, Dickerson Park Zoo, Wilson's Creek National Battlefield and many others.
