



Roll into Bowling Green on a Friday afternoon between April and August and you may catch a **Hot Rods**Minor League Baseball game, or head downtown on Friday evenings in July and August for free Concerts in the Park.



Get a good night's rest because Saturday begins bright and early at **Beech Bend Amusement Park** & **Splash Lagoon**, home of the region's most twisted wooden roller coaster and a gigantic wave pool and lazy river. The adjacent **Raceway** features weekly drag racing.

Sneak in some shopping that afternoon at **Fountain Square** downtown or take a tour of the innovative **Corsair Distillery**. After dinner at one of our locally owned restaurants, why not go bowling, play mini-golf or enjoy some nightlife!

On Sunday, explore the world below the streets of Bowling Green at Lost River Cave & Valley. The gang will learn how Civil War soldiers, bank robbers, prohibitionists, and Native Americans used the cave and valley, then take Kentucky's only underground boat tour. But don't stop here... there are eight other public caves in the region. From the beautiful formations of Diamond Caverns to the grandeur of Mammoth Cave, nothing beats the heat on a hot summer day like heading underground for some of nature's air conditioning!



Kick back down on the farm that afternoon for a sweet treat at **Chaney's Dairy Barn** where over 30 flavors of their homemade ice cream are waiting to tempt your taste buds. If fruit is more your flavor, drive up to **Jackson's Orchard** for some delicious apples, peaches or berries.



Not a summer trip or having bad weather? Take in a local performance instead. Bowling Green has two professional and two youth theatre troupes, a symphony, an orchestra, plus the state-of-the-art **Southern Kentucky Performing Arts Center** that hosts touring Broadway shows and local acts.
