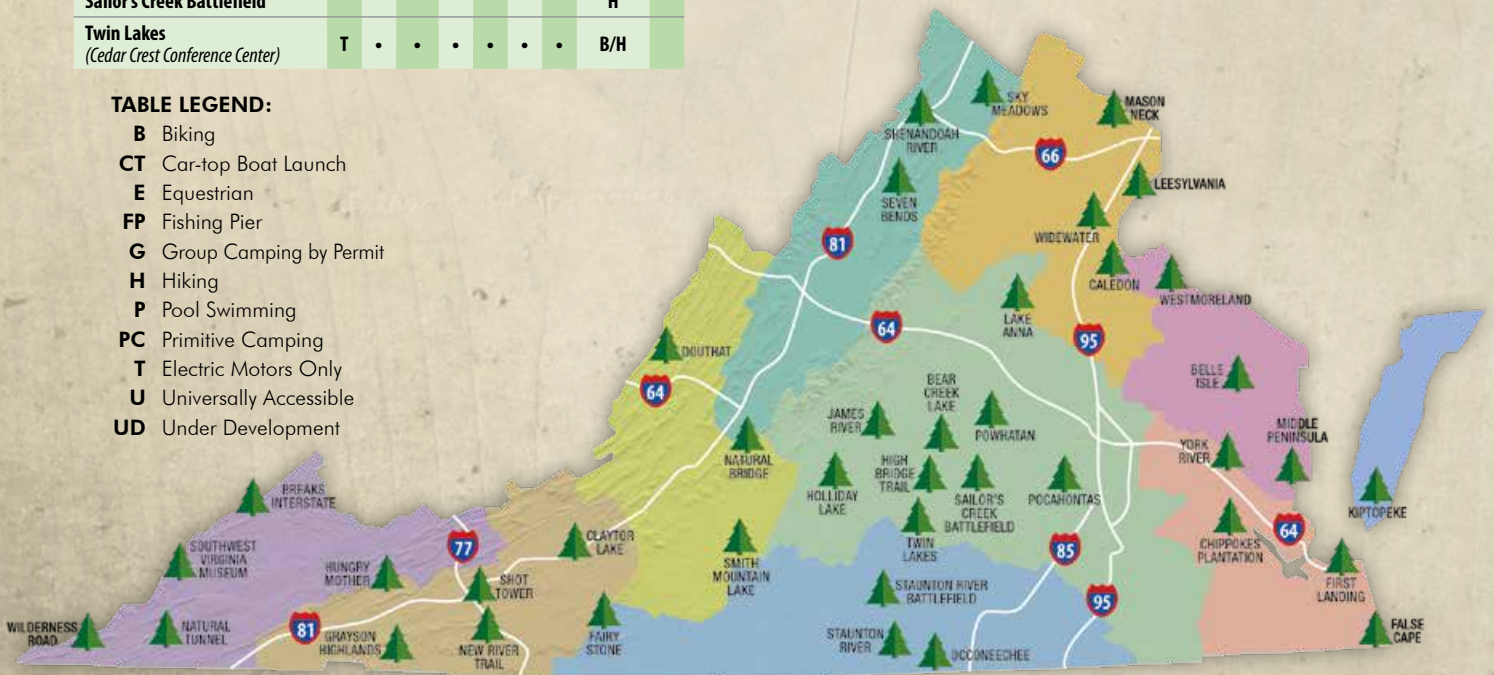

With more than 300 cabins, 1,800 campsites and a growing number of yurts, the fun doesn't end at sundown. Many cabins are available year-round, and most campgrounds are open March to December. Many parks offer overnight facilities for reunions, weddings and special events. Some parks even have equestrian campsites.

Discounts

Virginia State Parks are also inexpensive. Discount and annual passes for parking, boat launching and swimming make visits even more affordable.

Pets

Pets are welcome, but must be on a leash no longer than 6 feet or in an enclosed area at all times. Cabin guests are charged \$10 plus tax per night per pet. No pet fee is charged for camping.
