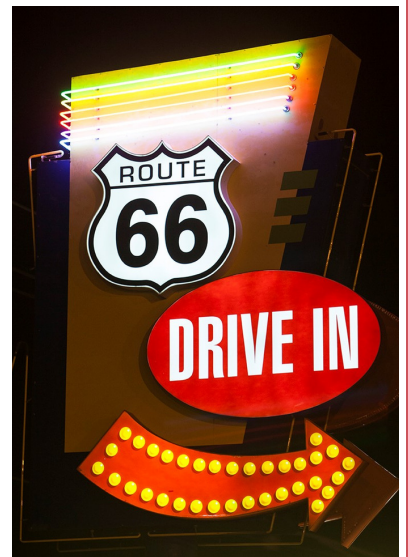
Taste an American treasure at the Cozy Dog Drive-In

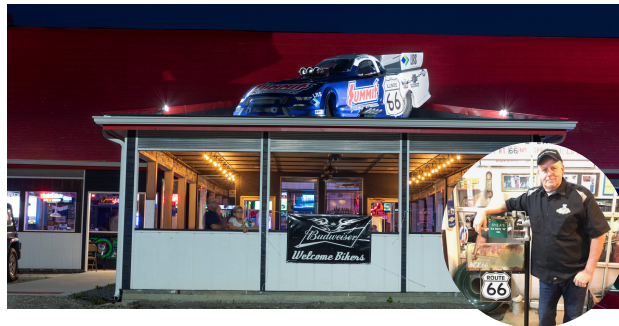
