**Day 1:** Check in and start your fun-filled summer vacation in the great outdoors. Whether you choose a cozy cabin in the mountains or set up a camper at one of Sevierville's luxurious RV campgrounds there are plenty of ways to enjoy our area's natural beauty.

When the weather is warm, head to the water. Marinas at Douglas Lake offer boat and kayak rental. Want to try Paddle Boarding? Smoky Mountain SUP rents and delivers stand up paddle boards. They'll even provide a quick lesson to get things started.

Anglers love Sevierville, where both river and lake fishing are popular outdoor activities. Our waters are known for smallmouth bass and crappie. Get a one-day fishing license and hit the water on your own or head out with a guide to discover the best fishing holes.

Then take a hike. Great Smoky Mountains National Park, America's most visited, has over 800 miles of maintained trails and beautiful spring wildflowers.



**Day 2:** Take a drive to the country. Sevierville's scenic driving tours combine the natural beauty of the Smokies with historical points of interest for a memorable road trip. Begin the day with a visit to downtown Sevierville and snap a quick photo with the bronze Dolly Parton statue on the Sevier County Courthouse lawn. Then venture out on one of several driving tours available on [VisitSevierville.com](http://VisitSevierville.com) for a different way to experience the Smokies.

Spend the afternoon browsing quaint antique shops along the way – you'll discover art galleries, distilleries, antique stores, and one-of-a-kind attractions all tucked away in the foothills of the Smoky Mountains.

**Day 3:** Start the day early with a tee time at the Sevierville Golf Club. Two 18-hole championship courses offer challenging play and beautiful mountain views. Choose to play one course, both courses, or just the Highlands front nine.

In the afternoon, explore family fun attractions in Sevierville. Mini-golf enthusiasts should visit Ripley's Old MacDonald's Mini Golf where three interactive courses filled with fun animated characters – like flying pigs and chatty chickens – make playing these courses a must. Those who feel the need for speed will love feeling the wind in their hair on one (or more) of eight family-friendly go-kart tracks at Nascar SpeedPark Smoky Mountains.

The newest attraction on the horizon is Soaky Mountain Waterpark, a 50-acre attraction featuring plenty of waterslides, a one-of-a-kind water coaster, a winding wave river, kid friendly activity pools and more. Soaky Mountain Waterpark is scheduled to open in summer 2020.
