

Kinzua Bridge

State Park



Kinzua Sky Walk

"One of the top 10 most Beautiful Skywalks in the World"

This engineering masterpiece, is the re-invention of the original Kinzua Viaduct following the

tornado of 2003. The Kinzua Viaduct, first constructed in 1882, soared 301 feet high and 2,053 feet across, and was the highest and longest railroad bridge in the world.

History of the Bridge

In 1882, **General Thomas Kane**, decorated American Civil War Veteran, and President of the New York, Lake Erie and Western Railroad and Company, had rich coal deposits south of the Kinzua Gorge. But since his customers were to the north, Kane needed to cross the valley. Kane needed a bridge.

Chief Engineer Octave Chanute accepted the challenge. He contracted the Pennsylvania firm of Clarke, Reeves & Company to design and fabricate the bridge. Adolphus Bonzano designed a wrought iron bridge using his "Phoenix Column," an engineering breakthrough that enabled tall structures to resist vibration and buckling.

The bridge was pre-fabricated in Phoenixville, near Philadelphia, and transported to the site for erection. Once the sandstone foundation piers were in place, 125 men, working 10-hour days, completed the construction in just 94 days.

Kinzua is the Seneca word for "fish on a spear."


Three and one-half million pounds of iron and \$275,000 later, the first steam-powered train rolled across delivering General Kane's coal to market.

Standing 301 feet tall (24 feet higher than the Brooklyn Bridge), the Viaduct quickly became a tourism destination. Walking out on the bridge was the next best thing to flying. Sightseers from around the globe visited the majestic bridge to experience the thrill of "Walking the Tracks Across the Sky." In 1900, the viaduct was rebuilt of steel to handle the heavier freight trains carrying coal, lumber, and oil. For generations, visitors and freight trains crossed the Kinzua Gorge on this National Civil Engineering Landmark.



On July 21, 2003, an F1 tornado tore through the forest heading for the bridge. Hundreds of trees were ripped from their roots, only nine of the original towers remained standing following the tornado. Following a massive restoration project, six of the towers left standing were reinvented as the Kinzua Sky Walk. Today visitors can walk out 624 feet, at a height of 225 feet, and peer down through a partial glass floor for an awesome 360-degree view of the Kinzua Gorge.

Kinzua Sky Walk

Towering into the Kinzua Gorge 624 feet, at a height of 225 feet, visitors can walk the length of the skywalk and then peer down below through a partial glass overlook.

The Kinzua Sky Walk is open from 8 am to dusk, 7 days a week. Admission is free to both the park and the skywalk.

North Country National Scenic Trail

Backpacking and Hiking – With 96.6 miles of completed trail marked with blue blazes, the North Country Trail is the longest trail in the Allegheny National Forest (ANF). It is one of three designated National Scenic Trails in Pennsylvania and provides vistas of the Allegheny Reservoir as it passes through rock outcroppings, open hardwoods, old growth forests and stands of hemlock.

A trailhead with a parking area is located along Rt. 346 west of the City of Bradford. From this northern point, situated along the New York-Pennsylvania state line near Willow Bay Recreation Area, the North Country Trail winds south to Tionesta Scenic Area. The trail then heads west to Dunham Siding, then south to the ANF boundary and onto Cook Forest State Park.



Perfect for backpacking, the northern section from Rt. 346 to the Red Bridge Recreational Area is about 30 miles, so allow two to three days.

Difficulty level is rated moderate to difficult.

Minister Creek Trail - This 10.0 mile trail begins at the Minister Creek Campground and forms a loop. The trailhead parking lot is located on Rt. 666 across from Minister Creek Campground, 14.7 miles southwest of Sheffield. Marked with grey diamonds, this trail is for hiking and skiing.

Difficulty level is rated more difficult.



Morrison Trail - A 10.8 mile loop trail. Passing through open hardwoods and large rock formations, the ground cover is thick with strands of mountain laurel, blooming in the spring to early summer. The trailhead parking lot is located along Rt. 59, 17 miles west of the City of Bradford.

Difficulty level is rated moderate to difficult.

Rimrock Overlook & Trail - 1.3 mile pedestrian trail connects the overlook with Kinzua Beach Recreation Area. Highlights of the overlook include the massive rock formations and scenic vistas of the shorelines of the

Allegheny Reservoir. From Bradford, travel west on Rt. 59 to a left-hand turn at the Rimrock Access Road and drive 2.7 miles to Rimrock Parking/Picnic Area or travel further west on Rt. 59 (19 miles from Bradford) to access Kinzua Beach Recreation Area. *Difficulty level is rated easy to moderate.*

Timberdoodle Flats Interpretive Trail

- Two trail loops totaling 1.75 miles. The timberdoodle is the nickname of the American woodcock, one of the many birds you might get a glimpse of along the trail. The Woodcock Loop is marked with a yellow woodcock insignia and features 12 interpretive stops. The shorter Bluebird Trail is suitable for wheelchairs or walking assistance equipment and features six interpretive stops. Perfect for casual hikers, parents with children, or first-time birders. Trailhead is along Rt. 59, west of Bradford.

Difficulty level is rated easy.



Trails within McKean County - 21 Trails

McKean County is Trail Central™. Home of the Tuna Valley, Kinzua Valley, Knox & Kane, Potato Creek, and Willow Creek Snowmobile Trail systems.

Blaisdell-Emerly Trail - 3.8 mile trail for bicycling and easy walking. Trail begins at the trailhead located on Owens Way in South Bradford and ends on Main Street in Lewis Run. Trail is a crushed stone surface and travels beneath the Rt. 219 underpass, and over bridges near Minard Run and Browntown Road. Sites along the way include the historic Penn Brad Oil Museum. Trail parking is also located just south of the museum.

Difficulty level is rated easy.



Community Parks Trail - A 3.3 mile urban loop trail which connects Richard McDowell Community Trail at the University of Pittsburgh at Bradford, to the Kessel Athletic Complex, to Callahan Park, then on to downtown Bradford and Hanley Park. Trail includes 8-piece exercise area for adults and climbing-balance area for children. Trailhead parking along Campus Drive at McDowell Trailhead, and Davis Street at Hanley Park in downtown Bradford.

Difficulty level is rated easy.


Crook Farm Trail - A 3 mile hiking trail loops along the banks of the scenic Tunungwant Creek - one might spy the occasional American Bald Eagle soaring overhead. Just north of the City of Bradford, the trailhead is located at the Crook Farm Homestead, a heritage site that features a one-room schoolhouse and restored farmhouse from the 19th century. From the north, travel Rt. 219 to Foster Brook Exit, exit right, turn right at the light, one mile on the right is Crook Farm. *Difficulty level is rated easy.*



Eagle Trail - A 1.41 mile loop trail marked with orange badges. Trail features four benches situated at scenic nature vistas for resting and reflecting. Trailhead is located in the gravel parking lot of the Olmsted Maintenance Building on Overbrook Road in Ludlow, PA.

Difficulty level is rated easy.

Goosechaser Trail - This 3/4 mile long trail loops along the banks of Marvin Creek in Hamlin Lake Park in Smethport. Named for the Canada geese that frequent the lake, the trail skirts the habitats of many wetland creatures, including water fowl. Access is from Route 6 to Willow Street, Hamlin Lake Park entrance. Free Parking. Public restrooms. *Difficulty level is rated easy.*



Kinzua Bridge State Park Trails

Kinzua Sky Walk – A distinctive hike on the Kinzua Sky Walk, a pedestrian overlook built upon the historic towers of the Kinzua Viaduct, which now extends 624 feet into the Kinzua Gorge, providing stunning views year round.

General Kane Trail – A 1.6 mile loop hiking trail, named after Thomas Leiper Kane, leads through hardwood forests of black cherry and maple trees including areas ravaged by the 2003 tornado. *Difficulty level is rated easy.*



Kinzua Creek Trail – Winds down the steep side of the gorge for 0.4 miles. Access is off the pathway between the skywalk and the wooden overlook. This trail offers up-close views of the original steel towers toppled by the 2003 tornado.

Difficulty level is rated difficult.



Kinzua Valley Trail – A 10.5 mile trail from Red Bridge Campground, past Westline, to Rt. 219. Enjoy hiking, biking and cross-country skiing. Trail is located along the scenic Kinzua Creek within the Allegheny National Forest. Trail surface is crushed limestone. Trailheads, one along Rt. 219 on the road to Westline, Westline, then 2 miles east from Kane, travel north on Rt. 321 to the intersection of Rt. 321 and FR 122. Two trailhead kiosks mark the intersection of the Kinzua Valley Trail and the North Country Trail.

Difficulty level is rated moderate.



Knox & Kane Rail Trail – Two sections have different allowable uses. Both handicapped accessible. **MJ2KB** – Hike/Bike, Equestrian, Cross-Country Ski, Snowmobile. 8-mile, trail surface aggregate. Trail links the Kinzua Bridge State Park (KBSP) to Lantz Corners, PA. KBSP trailhead parking hike/bike is in the park's overflow parking area. Horse trailers along Lindholm Road. Mt. Jewett trailhead behind Borough

Office-Center/Peterson Streets. Additional trailer parking along Hacker Street (off Kushequa Avenue). **TAMED** – Hike/Bike, Cross-Country Ski. 8-miles completed, from the Rt. 6 crossing by the Kane Country Club, through Kane, to just south of the National Fuel Gas Pump Station in Lamont. Trailhead is at Route 6/Welsh Street, across from the Country Fair.

Difficulty level is rated easy on both trail sections.

Bullis Hollow Trail – An 8.3 mile trail within the Allegheny National Forest that connects to the Marilla Springs Trail at the upper trailhead. From there the trail heads west along a narrow gauge railroad grade, crossing FS 137 and climbing to reach the Tracy Ridge Trail Network/North Country Trail. Trail is excellent for backpacking.

Difficulty level is rated moderate to difficult.



Marilla Trail System

Marilla Bridges Trail – A 1 mile loop with forest and water vistas. Highlights include the Erik Benjamin Covered Bridge which spans the spillway of the Marilla Reservoir, two rustic wooden trestle bridges, and a delightful gazebo located at the southwest corner of the trail. Non-motorized use only. The trailhead is located along Rt. 346, five miles west of the city of Bradford. *Difficulty level is rated easy.*



Marilla Brides Trail - Erik Benjamin Covered Bridge


Cornelius Connection at Gilbert Reservoir

A 2.4 mile linear trail which spans from Marilla to Gilbert Reservoir. This dirt path trail, through mixed hardwood forest is perfect for backwoods hiking. This non-groomed trail is great for snowshoeing in the winter. Trailheads are located near both Reservoirs. From Bradford, take Rt. 346 west for five miles and park at Marilla Reservoir; or just after Marilla, take the limestone gravel road on the right, for five miles, turn right at the gate and descend to the upper trailhead. *Difficulty level is moderate.*



Hidden Valley Passage – This 3.5 mile loop begins at the Indian Pipe Trailhead on Rt. 346 across from the upper end of Marilla Reservoir. A sign marks the trail at the Indian Pipe kiosk. This trail follows an 1880s narrow gauge railroad grade. After 1.5 miles, bear right and follow the blue diamonds to the top of the ridge where it joins Indian Pipe and travels back to the Marilla Reservoir. *Difficulty level is rated moderate.*

Indian Pipe Trail – This 7.4 mile non-motorized trail crosses a 4,000 acre Allegheny Northern Hardwood Forest which is under the stewardship of the Bradford Water Authority. This is a good trail for bicycling, cross-country skiing, and snowshoeing, as well as hiking. It is mostly on roads and is wide and smooth. A multitude of flora and fauna species can be observed from this trail, including the Indian Pipe flower (*monotropa uniflora*). Travel Rt. 346 west of Bradford five miles; trailhead access is on the right. *Difficulty level is rated moderate.*



Marilla Rocks Trail - A 2.0 mile loop off a logging road that is accessible from Rt. 346. Blue diamonds mark the trail that leads to the rock formations, continue following the diamonds for a loop back to the logging road. Trailhead parking is near the gate on Rt. 346, approximately two miles from the Marilla Reservoir, on the left hand side of the road if traveling west.

Difficulty level is rated moderate to difficult



Marilla Springs Trail - This 3.6 mile point to point trail is a slightly more aggressive trail experience for the avid hiker and mountain biker, perfect for snowshoe and cross-country skiing in the winter. The lower trailhead begins at the southwest corner of the Marilla Bridges Trail. At the upper trailhead, the trail connects to Forest Road (FR) 173H, turn right to cross into the

ANF and FR 173, a major forest road between Rt. 346 (Willow Creek) and Rt. 321 at Sugar Run. Limestone surface, progressive changes in elevation, old growth forest. *Difficulty level is rated moderate to difficult.*


White Pine Trail - 3 mile loop past towering, old growth white pines. Entrance to the trail is at the confluence of Marilla Brook and Lean-to Run from the Marilla Bridges Trail, follow the run upstream to the white pines.

Difficulty level is rated moderate.



Richard McDowell Community Trail - 1.4 mile, 10 ft. wide paved surface trail meanders along the west branch of the Tunungwant Creek. The trail features six bridges, five raised walkways, a gazebo and water vistas. Trail access is via Campus Drive, close to the University of Pittsburgh at Bradford.

Difficulty level is rated easy.



Shawmut Trail - 1 mile non-motorized interpretive trail. It follows Marvin Creek, traversing woodland settings, open meadows, and farm land. Sights along the way include the historic McKean County Poor Farm. This all season trail is open to hiking, bicycle riding, birding, cross-country skiing, and snowshoeing. The

trailhead is located along Route 6, west of Smethport, near the Marvin Creek Bridge. ADA parking and accessibility. *Difficulty level is rated easy.*

Wolfinger Trail System - A system of trails available for hiking, horseback riding, and mountain biking close to Smethport. Many loops can be made, from a short half hour stroll along Sandy Lane to several hours' worth of vigorous hiking on the North Trail. Begin at the main trailhead, located on Rt. 46 north, 1.1 miles from the Route 6 intersection (41.827214N -78.427578W), on the left side by the gate.

Difficulty level is rated easy to moderate.

Mountain Biking Trails

In the Allegheny National Forest, mountain bikes are permitted on all forest roads, all ATV trails, and most hiking and cross-country ski trails.



Jakes Rock Trails is a 30+ mile trail system designed by Trails Solutions, a world class trail company affiliated with IMBA (International Mountain Biking Association). This stacked loop mountain biking trail system appeals to riders of all skill levels.

Morrison Trail is a popular 10.8 mile loop for mountain biking. The large trailhead is located along Rt. 59. Willow Creek, Marienville, Rocky Gap and Timberline trails are shared use with ATVs.

Biking is permitted on all State Forest roads and old logging roads, with mountain bikes recommended.

Biking

Kinzua Bridge Scenic Byway - The access road to the Kinzua Bridge State Park and the Kinzua Sky Walk, is a shared use road for bikes/vehicles.

A favorite family-friendly trail for biking is the *Kinzua Valley Trail* in Westline. Other recommended trails include the one mile *Shawmut Trail* in Smethport, the *Richard McDowell Community Trail*, the *Community Park Trail*, and the *Crook Farm Trail* in Bradford. The *Blaisdell-Emerly Trail* has a trailhead at the Penn Brad Oil Museum along Rt. 219 just south of Bradford.

Outdoor Adventures

Waterfalls in the Allegheny National Forest

Bent Run Waterfall - Located along Rt. 59, in the Allegheny National Forest. Access is from a small parking lot at a bend in the road, across from the eastern edge of the Kinzua Dam parking lot. The waterfall flows especially well during heavy rains and spring run-off, but the flow can dwindle down to a trickle quite often. Bent Run is a short hike, full of nooks and crannies and easy climbing.



Hector Falls - A strange geologic formation surrounds this waterfall, with a height of only around 22 feet, it is set amidst a collection of large boulders. This waterfall plummets from a rectangular shaped rock face and has a lost world type of feel. When the water levels are high, the water flows off two different faces, when low the flow goes down to a trickle. Parking for the falls is located about 2 miles down a dirt road, which starts in the town of Ludlow on Route

6 in McKean County. Falls location: 41.6853N -78.975067W.

Water Trails

Allegheny River Trail - Enter the Allegheny River in Roulette, Pennsylvania at the intersection of Burlson and Brophy Avenues (41.778858N -78.163206W), then 16 miles to Dunbar Road (41 51.192N - W 078 19.224W), then 5.8 miles to the Larrabee Y where Potato Creek joins the Allegheny River (41.901384N -78.384720W). To Gleason Hollow Launch (78.341986N -42.050615W), which is the first water access in New York State. Then 2.5 miles to Linn Launch (78.356944N -42.050615W) at 1060 Steam Valley Road, Portville, NY 14770. Linn Launch is handicap accessible. *Difficulty level is rated easy.*



Potato Creek Water Trail -

Three canoe and kayak launch areas. Unload your canoe behind the ball field in Crosby on Route 46 (41.748614N -78.393427W) to float 6.4 miles on the Potato Creek to East Smethport on Route 6. From there float 10.9 miles to Coryville off Champlin Hill Road towards Turtle Point (41.88187N -78.389500W). From Coryville you can float another 2.7 miles to reach the Larabee Y (41.901384N -78.384720W), where you have great access to the Allegheny River. Special Regulations on State Game Lands. *Difficulty level is rated easy.*



Myth or Fact? Can Bigfoot really be living here?

Many locals believe Bigfoot is here. Animal Planet filmed in the region and recorded positive sightings, and a game camera mounted in a tree by Rick Jacobs in a remote area of the ANF raises questions. Others just want to have fun searching for signs of Bigfoot.

In the meantime, have your photo taken beside a statue of Bigfoot at Rock City Park, the Model T Inn, or at Bell's Market in Kane where you can also shop for Bigfoot Sausage. Squatchfest.org for details on his local musicfest appearance.

Geocaching Trails

Registration is free for this real-world, outdoor treasure hunt. You can also register on-line or a specially designed piece of equipment named a GPS Unit available at many sporting goods stores.

To get started, the popular zip codes in our region are: 16701, 16735, 16731, 16347, 16333, 16740 and 14779. Use clues that are displayed, and the GPS directions to find the hidden caches. A cache, in geocaching language, is the hidden item containing either a code, stamp or other prize such as a trackable geocoin.

Birding Trails

Location is everything, they say, and that goes for the Allegheny National Forest Region and birds. More than 200 species of birds can be found in the Allegheny National Forest, including bald eagles and osprey.

The most common birds found are the ruffed grouse, the state bird of Pennsylvania, and the wild turkey. Buzzard Swamp, south of Kane, is a prime area to view these birds. The mourning warbler will likely be seen in clear-cut areas. Some of the



most common warblers seen here are yellow, chestnut-sided, yellow-rumped, northern parula and bay-breasted. The hardwood forests are home to such birds as the yellow-bellied sapsucker, winter wren and hermit thrush.

Osprey (*Pandion haliaetus*) are a fish-eating bird of prey usually mating for life. Osprey nests may be viewed from Rt. 321 from the Red Bridge Area, Chappel Bay, Sugar Bay and Rt. 346 from Willow Bay.

Bald eagles (*haliaetus leucocephalus*) are among the largest birds of prey. They may weigh up to 14 pounds and have seven-foot wingspans. Bald eagles are readily identified by their white heads and tails; however, they don't attain this plumage until five years of age. They nest in large trees near water. Bald eagles have been sighted at the Allegheny Reservoir, Tunungwant Creek, and north of Eldred along the Allegheny River and Oswayo Creek.

Birding Sites

An excellent interpretive trail, *Timberdoodle Flats*, is a 1.4 mile loop trail located along Rt. 59 southwest of Bradford. This trail is named for the American woodcock, also known as the timberdoodle, which uses both the forest and open areas for nesting.

At *Tracy Ridge Campground*, you might find a northern saw-whet owl from March through July. Cerulean warblers sing in the oak trees along the *Tracy Ridge Trail*.

Other suggested sites for birding are *Marilla Reservoir*, Rt. 346 in the *Willow Bay* area connecting to NY Rt. 280 along the northern portion of the *Allegheny Reservoir*, and along Rt. 59 at the *Big Bend Birding Overlook* just past the Kinzua Dam.





Beaches

Allegheny Reservoir Beaches – Kinzua Beach has no daily fee and is located across from the Kinzua Wolf Run Marina; Kiasutha Beach has a daily fee; both provide picnic tables, grill stands, restrooms and garbage collection.



Fishing

The Allegheny National Forest offers the angler a variety of fishing opportunities from small native brook trout to trophy fishing for muskie, pike and walleye in the Allegheny Reservoir. The Allegheny Reservoir, a 12,000-acre impoundment on the Allegheny River, is the largest reservoir in the Forest.

Fly fishing: The Forest abounds with hundreds of miles of stream trout fishing from the large tailwater fishery at the base of the Kinzua Dam to the tiny brook trout streams on the Allegheny Plateau. Kinzua Creek is a local favorite. Grey fox, march brown, green drakes and native brown trout are found in these waters.

Canoeing and Kayaking

The Allegheny National Forest provides camping and launching facilities in Pennsylvania. In New York the Seneca Nation of Indians (716-945-1790), Cattaraugus County (716-354-2615), and Allegany State Park (716-354-9121) offer similar facilities.

The southern-most tips of the Red Bridge arm and Sugar Bay of the Allegheny Reservoir provide an excellent place for canoeing and kayaking. Access to these areas can be gained by using the Kiasutha Boat Launch or the unimproved boat launch at Longhouse (FR 609).
