Abbotsford is home to the annual Christmas Parade, held the first Saturday evening in December since 1971, a true Christmas parade with no commercial floats. The hundreds of characters, lighted floats and walking units bring spectators by the bus load from all over Wisconsin year after year.

The Rural Arts Museum entered a second era of development, the Heritage Building was built for the display of artifacts, during Wisconsin's sesquicentennial year. It features a rural main street in the 1890s. Welcome to Dorchester

The Village of Dorchester was founded in 1873, and is located in Clark and Marathon counties in beautiful central Wisconsin. With a population of just 875, Dorchester is a quintessential small town – but one which offers easy access to an abundance of amenities and opportunities found in larger cities. Come spend the summer camping and fishing in our 43-acre park, ice fishing in the winter, and access to hundreds of miles of ATV/UTV and snowmobile trails all year long. Come camp in Clark County's largest park

Dorchester Park's humble beginnings began with a simple conversation in 1967. Three years later the largest park in Clark County was open to the public. Camping is open from May 1 - October 31, and sites are available with or without electricity and sanitary sewer, so bring your RV, or tent and spend the summer in Dorchester. The 12-acre lake is ready for fishing with trout, bass, and bluegill. There are also shelters available for rent for your summer party or family reunion. Dorchester Park has biking and walking trails around the lake which take you past the S.S. Dorchester Memorial, honoring the more than 600 men who died off the coast of Newfoundland in 1942.

Dorchester Memorial Hall – home of the Dorchester Red Devils

The summer of 1950 was the birth of the Dorchester Memorial Hall. The large community center was erected for the purpose of providing the Dorchester School District with a gymnasium and the community with a place for entertainment. The upstairs contains a large basketball court, a stage for a band and also a kitchen. The downstairs area consists of six bowling lanes, a kitchen, and a bar area. The Dorchester Red Devils' first game was in 1951, and they played until 1963, when Dorchester School District merged first with Abbotsford, and then later with Colby. The Memorial Hall still remains. A lot of improvements have been made to the hall throughout the years. The hall is available to rent for weddings, banquets, family reunions, bowling, and more.

Chili

Chili, a small town in southeastern Clark County, reportedly got its name in 1881, from railroad officials determined to name the various stops along the line. At one stop, due to fierce blowing winds, officials would not leave the train. "Chilly" was the way the railroad officials described it, and after a misspelling, the name "Chili" came about. The railroad tracks are long gone, but miles of beautiful and well-maintained snowmobile and ATV trails run through Chili linking northern and southern Clark County to Wood County.

The Fire Department's Chili Street Dance is the main event in the community during the first weekend in August featuring live music, Little League baseball tournament, kids' activities, food & concessions and the Loyal Mini-Rodders Pull.



People, progress, & pride

Greenwood, originating from the combination of two previous names, Greenland and Land of the Big Woods was incorporated in 1891. Greenwood is a peaceful city nestled on the banks of picturesque Black River. It's a community where people take pride in their progressive focus well into the future while keeping the relaxed, less complicated lifestyle of the past. Whether you are a visitor or a new resident, you are always welcome in Greenwood, the heart of Clark County. Greenwood boasts of a thriving agricultural industry evident by the prosperous farms and milk processing plants. It is home of the world's largest family owned butter producer, Grassland Dairy.

Special attractions

Come and see the Peace Memorial, sculpted by Professor Ernest Durig from Switzerland who visited Greenwood in 1937. The memorial is sculpted from white sand and white cement, as far as it is known, it is the only monument made of this material in the United States. The memorial represents the Gold Star Mother holding with one arm, a fallen soldier, and the other hand holding high the American Flag. Greenwood's many activities include: Fourth of July Class C men's softball tournament, large fireworks display, Concerts in the Park, and Lion's and 4-H softball tournaments. Greenwood's End of Summer Fest features a car show, walk/run event, auction, many vendors, live music, children's entertainer, big screen movie at dusk, parade, and queen coronation. Nestled in the northwest corner of the Black River State Forest near scenic Hatfield, Wisconsin, 839-acre Lake Arbutus offers visitors and residents excellent opportunities for fishing and recreation. Located in both Clark and Jackson counties, the lake spans the border between the Mississippi-Chippewa Rivers region and the Central Sands Prairie region. Lake Arbutus offers year-round activities such as water skiing, boating, canoeing, swimming, horseback riding, hiking, cross country skiing, and snowmobiling, making your stay on the lake highly enjoyable.

With over nine miles of shoreline and two county parks, Lake Arbutus is a fantastic place to spend a day or a week. 
Recreation & events

Bicycling

The Levis/Trow Mound Recreational Area in Southern Clark County Wisconsin, has become one of the premier mountain biking destinations in the Midwest. This cluster is one of the most overlooked in all the land and offers climbing not normally found outside of mountainous regions. Every ingredient necessary for great mountain biking is found here-stunning, unobstructed views, incredible singletrack, and beautiful medium-paced cross-country trails to transport riders around the grounds. Two towering mounds dominate the diverse terrain. Deer, turkey, fisher, bear, coyote and even a stray wolf can be spotted among the forested 300 foot tall sandstone bluffs. Well known for its fantastic 24 miles of mountain bike singletrack trails and home of an IMBA Epic Ride, Levis offers riders a variety of terrain, from easy meandering wooded singletrack to technical pitches and outstanding views of the surrounding 134,500 acre county forest. Levis Mound has been the home of the WEMS Buzzard Buster Mountain Bike Race, 12-hour and 100-mile WEMS races, and The Sweaty Yeti fatbike race, as well as other bike and racing events. Winter fatbike riders will find over 13.5 miles of machine packed snow bike singletrack trails, open all winter for a unique riding experience. More information: co.clark.wi.us

Off-Road Motorcycling

Knobby Ridge Motorcycle Trails offer approximately
16 miles of exciting and adventurous off-road trails which include 4 loops that wind through a stunning portion of the
134,500-acre Clark County Forest. For your convenience all motorcycle trails are clearly marked with white fiberglass posts and motorcycle decals. There is easy access to the trailhead located 8 miles west of Neillsville on State Highway 10. All motorcycles must have a trail use sticker. Trails are closed from March 16th to May 14th of each year and during the shooting hours of gun deer season. This trail also offers several youth loops, intensive use area and vault toilet. For your camping enjoyment, Snyder Campground is located nearby to help you take in all the beautiful scenery that Clark County has to offer. More information: co.clark.wi.us



Horseback Riding

Clark County is proud to offer some of the finest horse trails in Wisconsin. Take a ride through nature's masterpiece and experience the beauty and wonder of the land from horseback. Wild Rock has long been recognized as a desired destination for horseback riding trails. Recent expansions now provide for more than 40 miles of horseback trails that wind and loop through a portion of the 134,500 acre Clark County Forest. The trail system utilizes forest lands ranging from easy to more difficult terrain. The Wild Rock Horse Trail is mostly family oriented and easy to ride, however, the Seven Sisters Trail is a bit more of a challenge. Wild Rock County Park provides convenient trail access and a day use area complimented by playground equipment and a shelter. Overnight camping is available with 27 campsites, sanitary dump station, potable water and electric and water service to many sites. Picket lines and manure bunkers are available for use within the campground. Just 4 miles northwest of Wild Rock County Park, Rock Dam campground and day-use area also provides shower facilities, beaches, laundry and a convenience store. Trail passes are available at the self-registration station at Wild Rock Park or online. More information: co.clark.wi.us.



Hunting

Bond with family and friends during the hunting seasons as old traditions continue and new ones begin. Clark County's abundant wildlife population attracts many sportsmen to the area. Large blocks of county forestlands, along with many acres of forest croplands, are open to the public for hunting, providing well over 134,500 acres of hunting grounds. The county forest is breeding ground for many varied species from black bear to otter. Whitetail deer populations average 20-25 deer per square mile of deer range. Turkey populations have been increasing countywide with several zones of huntable numbers. There is also a healthy population of black bear in the county. Ducks, geese, and ruffed grouse are numerous and provide ample opportunity for hunters.

Enjoy spending some quality time with family and friends or take a leisurely walk by yourself. Learn about nature and your surroundings. The Clark County Forest allows hiking throughout its 134,500 acres and offers over 160 miles of trails, plus logging access trails and hunter trails that allow hiking at various skill levels. Levis/Trow Mound Recreational Area provides more than 34 miles of scenic trails and can be especially rewarding in the spring and fall when emerging plant life and autumn colors abound. A 1.5 mile segment is designed as a self-guided nature study trail with 15 stations that review a variety of natural resource features. Breathtaking views of Clark County can also be seen on connecting trails to the top of the mounds. Hiking opportunities also exist at Wildcat Mound (3 miles). Wildcat offers hiking opportunities that provide outstanding scenic vistas and a popular spot during fall colors. Geocachers from across the state are finding the Levis/Trow Mound area ideal for hide (and seeking) geocaches. Geocaching.com is the premier site to go explore anywhere in the world. Wildcat Mound is a spectacular feature in southwest Clark County. We also have great walking trails at The Highground Veterans Memorial Park that is open 24/7, year round as well as the Listeman Arboretum in Neillsville with a variety of trails along the Black River. Russell Park is also close to Levis Mound Recreational Area which offers the best mountain bike trail system in the Midwest, exceptional hiking trails and breathtaking scenery. Rock Dam offers modern camping and many recreational choices providing for multi-season outdoor experiences. The associated Rock Dam Lake offers substantial opportunity for

Cross Country Skiing

Clark County's premier cross-country ski trail system is Levis Mound. The Levis/Trow Mound Recreational Area consists of 17 miles of expertly groomed trails for skating and classic technique along with an additional 24 miles of ungroomed back country routes. The more advanced trails are located to the northwest on Trow Mound, while the easy and intermediate trails lie near the base of the mounds. Back country skiers can climb the narrow and difficult single track to the tops of the mounds for a spectacular view of the surrounding countryside. Deer, turkey, coyote and even a stray wolf can be spotted among the forested 300 foot tall sandstone bluffs. Ski trails are generally open the first part of December through the end of March of each year, depending on snow depth. More information: co.clark.wi.us

Many of these trails offer the perfect backdrop for casual trekkers, wildlife photographers, and naturalists to observe and track wildlife. 

Fishing/Ice Fishing

Throw out a line and pull in a memory. Clark County offers 3,700 acres of surface water for fish habitat and memory making. Game fish found in Clark County waters include muskellunge, walleye, large and small mouth bass, northern pike, and pan fish. Clark County has 593 miles of streams that are divided into three major river basins. They are the Chippewa Basin in the west, the Black River in the central, and the Wisconsin River in the eastern portion of the County. There are approximately 20 miles of trout streams in Clark County.

Enjoy a day on the water - relaxing, fishing, boating, canoeing, kayaking, swimming and so much more. Clark County has seven named lakes with an approximate total of 1,741 acres. There are a total of 150 named and unnamed streams in Clark County totaling 2,476

surface acres. These streams total about 593 miles. Our rock-strewn rivers and streams abound with fish, beaver, otter, muskrat, heron, sand hill crane, and eagle, giving the canoeist and fisherman memories from Clark County.



Feel the warmth of the sun on your face, the breeze in your hair, and the sparkle of the sunlight while enjoying some quality time on the water. Clark County offers visitors the silence of paddling a canoe or kayak, as well as the thrills of water skiing and the relaxation of pleasure boating. In addition to the many county lakes and

swimming beaches, the area has approximately 120 miles of paddling streams. The Black River offers plenty of opportunities for the casual paddler with long stretches of wooded areas and several scenic bluffs. From the confluence of the Popple River to Lake Arbutus, the river is perfect for the experienced paddler. Depending on the flow, the Black River has enchanting back waters to deep, calm areas.

Wildlife

Looking for ways to connect with nature and learn about the diversity of life? Clark County has an abundant wildlife population of whitetail deer, turkey, black bear, coyote, wolves, ducks, geese and ruffed grouse. Many of the impoundments in Clark County are managed for waterfowl habitat. Sportsman's Lake, north of Owen and the Winx Flowage near Neillsville provide many acres of waterfowl breeding, nesting and wood rearing habitat. Mallards, teal and wood ducks, as well as geese, commonly utilize these areas. Clark County is also home to a number of Wisconsin's endangered species including: Peregrine Falcon, Eastern Massasauga Rattlesnake, Barn Owl, Red-Shouldered Hawk, Great Egret, Bald Eagle, Cooper's Hawk, and the Karner Blue Butterfly.

Ruffed Grouse

A good day of grouse hunting comes complete with fresh air, the scent of pine and spruce, beautiful fall colors and the smell of a dew-soaked dog. The ruffed grouse has been called the all-American game bird and is one of the most popular upland game birds to hunt. Ruffed grouse are most commonly known for their distinctive "drumming" noise produced by males during the spring breeding season. Male grouse will display on drumming logs, rapidly beating their wings with the intention of attracting a female grouse. The 134,500-acre Clark County Forest offers excellent ground cover and overhead cover for the ruffed grouse. The Frank Vazquez Ruffed Grouse and Woodcock Management Area in the Town of Washburn is a 1,288-acre unit intensively managed to promote woodcock and ruffed grouse habitat.

Bird Watching

Welcome to Clark County, where a wonderful world of wildlife watching awaits you. Environmental tourism has become an important part of our diverse mix of outdoor recreation. Extensive wetlands, millions of acres of wild places, a broad range of natural habitat, and a commitment to environmental stewardship have made Clark County part of an outstanding regional birding opportunity. Clark County is part of the Central Sands Prairie Region of the Great Wisconsin Birding and Nature Trail. This project divides the state into five wildlife-viewing regions with driving trails that link important wildlife sites within each region.

The Great Wisconsin Birding & Nature Trail is a mapped auto trail that reaches into every area of the state. Full-color viewing guides with maps and descriptions of every site leads the nature traveler to warblers, shorebirds, eagles, loons, cranes and all manner of mammals found in some of the state's premier wildlife venues. Signs with the Sandhill Crane trail logo featured on this website mark sites on the trail. www.wisconsinbirds.org/trail

Sportsman's Lake Wildlife Area, a 1,200-acre wildlife area dominated by open marsh and grassy uplands is a good place to learn your waterfowl and add some new species to your checklist. During spring and fall migrations it attracts a variety of waterfowl and wetland birds. Signature species: Tundra Swan & American Woodcock Rare species: Least & American Bittern, Sora Rail & American Black Duck.

Mead Lake, the largest lake in Clark County, boasts a pair of county parks along its shores which include wetlands, woodlands, open water and shrubby marshlands. Besides viewing waterfowl of all types throughout the year, Osprey and Bald Eagles can be seen soaring on the summer thermals.

Signature species: Black-and-white Warbler & Clay-colored Sparrow **Rare species:** American White Pelican & Osprey

Schmidt Maple Woods State Natural Area, is an 87-acre heavily forested area with a mix of prairie, forests, scrub and hardwood stands offering habitat that attracts a variety of songbirds and wildlife. **Signature species:** Indigo Bunting, Scarlet Tanager & Chestnut-sided Warbler





The combination of cows grazing on lush pastures, soils deposited by glaciers, and the glacial water supply result in many unique, award-winning cheeses. Cheesemakers even refer to terroir, a French term used to describe how the grapes' flavor reflects the soil, air and water of a particular region. Descriptions of cheese sound like a slight twist on the bouquet of wine. Creamy. Intense. Fruity. Earthy. Buttery. Tangy. A hint of hazelnut. A floral finish. Clark County is truly the Napa Valley of the cheese industry. These cheeses range from the original Colby cheese developed in 1885, by Joseph Steinwand in Colby. WI to artisan cheeses (handmade products made in small batches) and farmstead cheeses (products made on the farm from milk produced by cows on that farm). Generations of cheesemakers call Clark County their home.





1897 CLARK COUNTY JAIL MUSEUM (I-12) 215 E 5th St, Neillsville

Visit the Historic 1897 Clark County Jail Museum and take a memorable trip back in time. Placed on the National and Wisconsin Historic Registers in 1978, the Museum is open each Sunday from 1-4 p.m. (Memorial Day – Labor Day). This one-of-a kind building is noted for its "castle-like" appearance,

complete with turrets and a formidable 3-story fortress-like architecture. As you walk through the front door, you enter the residence portion of the building. Each sheriff and his family lived in the two-story Victorian home during each term of office. The period furniture, ornate staircase, formal parlor with original Italian marble fireplace, and original virgin pine woodwork are highlights of the residence. Each room features a collection of items unique to the time period and Clark County: a child's bedroom, an authentic jewelry store, the Listeman family music room, and a room filled with photos and records, to name a few. The jail portion of the museum houses old law enforcement equipment and two floors of six cell blocks. Each block features a glimpse back in time to such places as the barbershop, the mercantile, the doctor's office, and a rural school house. The final floor houses our extensive display of flags, military artifacts, and uniforms from the Civil War to present day. Bus tours and/or other group tours are available by appointment. Located in the heart of Neillsville, the 120-year-old Victorian style home sits on three acres of land with over 600 feet of water front on O'Neill Creek. Listed on the national, state, and local historic registries, this home was built in 1892, by John Hein, a local lumberman and merchant. Now a bed and breakfast, with many updated features and amenities, it still retains its historic look and aesthetic appeal. Original antique patina wood floors and woodwork, including the fireplace mantel and fretwork, complimented by three sets of eight foot tall pocket doors and ten foot tall ceilings. Built in 1915, the Reed School served as a one-room country school through 1951. It provided a first- through eighth-grade education with only one teacher. The school is typical of the more than 6,000 one-room schools that dotted the landscape of rural WI. Reed School offers visitors a unique interpretation of country school life by focusing on the first half of the 20th century, specifically 1939. Open Weekends: May-Oct 10am to 4pm. RURAL ARTS MUSEUM (O-3) 1st St & Adams St, Colby



On the north end of Colby, along a spur of railroad that brought civilization to the territory, is a collection of buildings filled with stories, artifacts, and memories of middle Wisconsin. The Rural Arts Museum is home to the original Colby Train Depot, built in 1872, and moved to the site in 1972. The history of the railroad is complemented by dairy industry memorabilia. A 1-room country school was added, including an extensive book collection. It helps recall how knowledge was shared in the days past. The jewel of the Rural Arts Museum is the Schopper Log Home. The Heritage Building features a historical rural main street displaying artifacts. The Rural Arts Museum is operated by volunteers and benefactors and is open on the 1st and 3rd Sundays, June-August, form 1-4 p.m., from Memorial Day to Labor Day and also by appointment. SILVER DOME BALLROOM (F-12) W7670 US Hwy 10, Neillsville



Located 5 miles west of Neillsville on Hwy. 10, the Silver Dome Ballroom is listed in the National and State Registers of Historic Places for its unique architecture and its rich entertainment history. Built during the Great Depression and operating since 1933, the Silver Dome features many original fixtures, a floating maple dance floor and a beautiful arching Lamella truss design, referring mainly to the honeycomb pattern of bolted ceiling beams which allows for a clearspan interior - not a single post, pillar or beam obstructs the interior view of the ballroom. Although there may be some remaining Lamella truss dome structures, those and all others ever built were squared at each end. No Lamella truss dome structure has ever featured the rounded, band-shell style ends found on the Silver Dome, making it a one-of-a-kind building. Another most remarkable feature of the Silver Dome's construction is that the ballroom rests on dozens of concrete

piers which hold the entire structure about a foot off the ground. This design not only allows sufficient airflow to prevent the floor beams, flooring and other foundation materials from rotting, it also provides such "give" to the dance floor that dancers report being able to dance for hours without discomfort as compared to other, less-forgiving dance floors. Area dancers describe it as a "floating" dance floor. Except for some minor interior remodeling, the structure remains almost exactly as it was built, including the concrete pier; the ceiling, floor and wall beams and boards; and the maple dance floor. Many of the original or long-time fixtures and contents also remain, such as the circular bar, walk-in center cooler and cash registers. Today, the Silver Dome continues to present a wide variety of the finest national, regional and local entertainers and host many of the most important events in the lives of area families and businesses. silverdomeballroom.net



THORP AREA HISTORICAL & TELEPHONE MUSEUM (D-2)

305 W Birch St, Thorp

The Thorp Area Historical Society collects and displays history, genealogies, and artifacts of the area and world which have affected the local way of life. It also has a growing collection of early period farm equipment, machinery, clothing, household items, books, and war memories. It also includes the Telephone Heritage Room. Visitors will see over 100 telephones from around the world, dating back to 1894. The museum portrays the history of individual telephone companies in the state, preserving the stages of development and displaying the progression of the telephone industry from the late 1800s to the present. TUFTS' MANSION (I-12) 26 Hewett St, Neillsville

In 1885, Emery Bruley built the original Tufts' House in Neillsville. The house as it stands today reflects the changes of that period, as well as the personalities of each succeeding generation of owners. In 1886, the Bruley family exchanged houses with the Richard Dewhurst family. During this time the house took on a Victorian appearance. At Mr. Dewhurst's death in 1895, his daughter Mary and her husband, Wallace Hemphill, became the new owners. Reportedly, Marshall Fields did the interior decorating for their daughter's wedding in 1916. Mr. and Mrs. Robert Stoll then owned the house until 1961, when it was purchased by Colonel and Mrs. William B. Tufts, who did extensive remodeling. After their death, the home was given to the city for use as a museum. In 1996, the museum was purchased by Joseph and Stacie Boe. They restored much

A landmark of the Neillsville community for over five decades, WCCN's Wisconsin Pavilion originally served as the main entrance and basic exhibit for the State of Wisconsin at the 1964 and 1965 New York World's Fair in Flushing Meadow. Discover the story behind the Wisconsin exhibit at the Fair when you visit the Pavilion. Inside the Pavilion vou will find central studios for three radio stations; 107.5FM WCCN "The Rock", 1370AM WCCN "Timeless" and 92.7FM WPKG "Today's Best Hits" and Pavilion Cheese & Gifts. At Pavilion Cheese and Gifts you will find an assortment of exceptional artisan and specialty cheese. Find boutique wine carefully selected from around the world including Munson Bridge Wine crafted right here in Clark County. WOODLAND HOTEL (I-3) 207 Central Ave, Owen

The Woodland Hotel was designed by Claude & Starck and built by the John S. Owen Lumber Company in 1906. The 27room hotel was billed as one of northern Wisconsin's finest hotels when it first opened, featuring running water, central heating, electricity, and a public telephone. It had a restaurant and a writing room on the main floor, a ladies parlor on the second floor, and a billiard room, a barber shop, public bath, and salesman sample room on the lower level. In later years, the Hotel introduced its widely acclaimed "Smorgasbord", a home-cooked buffet extravaganza that was second to none. A popular night club style bar with live entertainment was introduced in the lower level of the Woodland in the 1940s. The Woodland Hotel is listed on the Wisconsin and National Registers of Historic Places and located on the historic Yellowstone Trail (www.yellowstonetrail.org). thehistoricwoodlandhotel.weebly.com/
