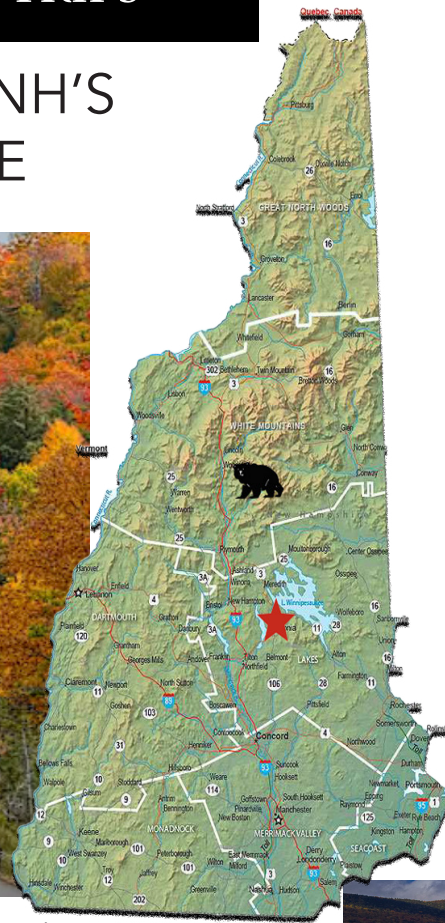

FEATURED ROAD TRIPS

THE KANCAMAGUS HIGHWAY

Nicknamed "the Kanc," this 35 mile scenic byway cuts through the White Mountain National Forest with breathtaking views of the White Mountains, the Swift River, Sabbaday Falls, Lower Falls and Rocky Gorge. The Kanc takes you to an elevation of just under 3,000 feet at its highest point. A must-see for foliage viewing.



CRAWFORD NOTCH STATE PARK

Crawford Notch State Park follows a stunning 30-mile stretch of U.S. Route 302 in New Hampshire, running between Glen and Twin Mountain. This dramatic mountain pass features free access, towering granite cliffs, cascading waterfalls, and easy roadside pull-offs to enjoy the brilliant colors of New Hampshire's fall foliage.



THE LAKES TOUR BYWAY

Start your Lakes Region Tour in Alton, following Route 11 towards Gilford and Weirs Beach. Make a stop and explore the Weirs' boardwalk, restaurants and public beach, before jumping on Route 25 towards Moultonborough, then taking Route 109 to the historic town of Wolfeboro—the oldest summer resort town in America.
